

Away Trip

BRSC Trip to Castres – January 2026 (Contributed by Chrissy Webb)

Wednesday 7th: A group of BRSC members went on a trip to Castres, organised by Thrive Sports Company. We were met at Bristol airport by Tom Giles who handed us our boarding passes and tickets for the match on Friday night. We arrived in Castres later that day in the dark and rain, and checked into our 4-star accommodation, Le Grand Hotel, which was very central to the small town.

Thursday 8th: A free day started with a hearty and leisurely breakfast, enjoying the great selection. Donning waterproofs most of us visited the tourist office before wandering around the town spotting other Bath Rugby supporters in coffee shops and bars seeking refuge from the wet conditions. Castres is a picturesque town, with many narrow streets, interesting architecture and colourful old houses. The River Agout flows through the middle, earning Castres the nickname of the Little Venice of Languedoc.

Friday 9th – Match Day: As the KO for the match wasn't until 21.00 local time we had most of the day at our leisure. More coffee shops, bars and restaurants were frequented by the increasing number of blue, black and white shirts.

Tom had arranged for us to have a meal with the Castres Supporters' Club before the match. They have their own clubhouse and BRSC members were treated to great French hospitality. We had four courses, washed down with red wine and other alcohol. We were lucky that one of our party spoke French very well and was able to translate for us all. We enjoyed a couple of hours in their company then headed over to the match. We did our best to drown out the French drums with 'Come on you Bath' and we became more vocal as the match progressed. We were even heard on the TV! Back at the hotel bar we celebrated our win and some very happy supporters headed for bed.

Saturday 10th: Once again, we had a free day so some ventured into Albi, another small town, and others headed towards the train station for a ride into Toulouse.

Sunday 11th: We woke up to blue skies and sunshine. We enjoyed the coach journey to Toulouse airport as this time it was in daylight. Flights were on time and we arrived back in Bristol earlier than anticipated.

Bath Rugby Foundation

Thanks to your generosity with donations made when renewing or signing up for membership, BRSC has been able to sponsor two students for this season (25/26). This will definitely help with the brilliant work that Bath Rugby Foundation does for the less fortunate young people of Bath. The Foundation has given us permission to publish two very different case histories, showing what the work can achieve for local youngsters. Although student sponsorship is not specific to a student both these students may well have been supported by BSRC.

Case study: Hi5! Club

When Morgan first joined Bath Rugby Foundation's Hi5! Club at just seven years old, he was shy and unsure about team sports. His mum, Catherine, stayed by his side through those early sessions, helping him take the first steps towards confidence.

Through encouragement, friendship, and trust, Morgan began to flourish. Hi5! Club became his safe space - a place where he could be himself, build friendships, and feel part of a community.

Now 22, Morgan is a confident, thriving young man who has become an inspiration to others. From a reserved child, he has grown into a Bath Rugby Ambassador, proudly representing the Foundation in London to receive a national award alongside Bath Rugby players and coaches.

He's also a key member of the Walcot Warriors Mixed Ability Rugby Team, where he continues to push his boundaries, build his skills, and lead by example. His love for Bath Rugby runs deep - he rarely misses a match and cheers louder than anyone when his team plays.

Catherine says, "Bath Rugby Foundation has made us feel supported, both for Morgan as a participant and for us as parents. We feel comfortable leaving him in great care, knowing he is happy."

Morgan's story has inspired his whole family, showing how inclusion and opportunity can change young lives. Once hesitant to join in, he now embraces every challenge with excitement - even discovering a love for new activities like golf through Hi5! Sport and Social Club.



Case study: Advantage

When Bobbi Mai first joined Bath Rugby Foundation's Summer Advantage course, she was unsure about what came next. Like many young people aged 16–25 who are not currently in education, employment, or training, she felt stuck, uncertain about her future and unsure where to begin.

"I didn't really know what I wanted to do," she recalls. "I'd tried looking for jobs but didn't have much confidence or experience to put myself out there."

Advantage is designed exactly for young people like Bobbi - providing a free space where participants can build confidence, gain life and work skills, and take practical steps towards employment or education.

During the course, Bobbi took part in a focused CV writing session led by the Foundation's team. Within just two hours of sending her CV alongside a job application, she had been invited to her first job interview.

"That moment gave me such a boost," says Bobbi. "It showed me that I do have something to offer, and that I just needed a bit of help to show it."

"Bobbi came in unsure but open-minded," says Liam, Advantage Lead. "By the end of the course, she was full of energy, motivation, and belief in herself. That's exactly what Advantage is about - breaking down barriers and helping young people move forward."

Since completing Advantage, Bobbi has attended an interview and is now exploring a college course in Hair and Beauty at College, a career path she discovered after Bath Rugby Foundation helped her uncover her passion and believe in her potential to pursue it.

"I'm really looking forward to starting something new," she says. "Before coming to Bath Rugby Foundation, I wouldn't have had the confidence to even try."
